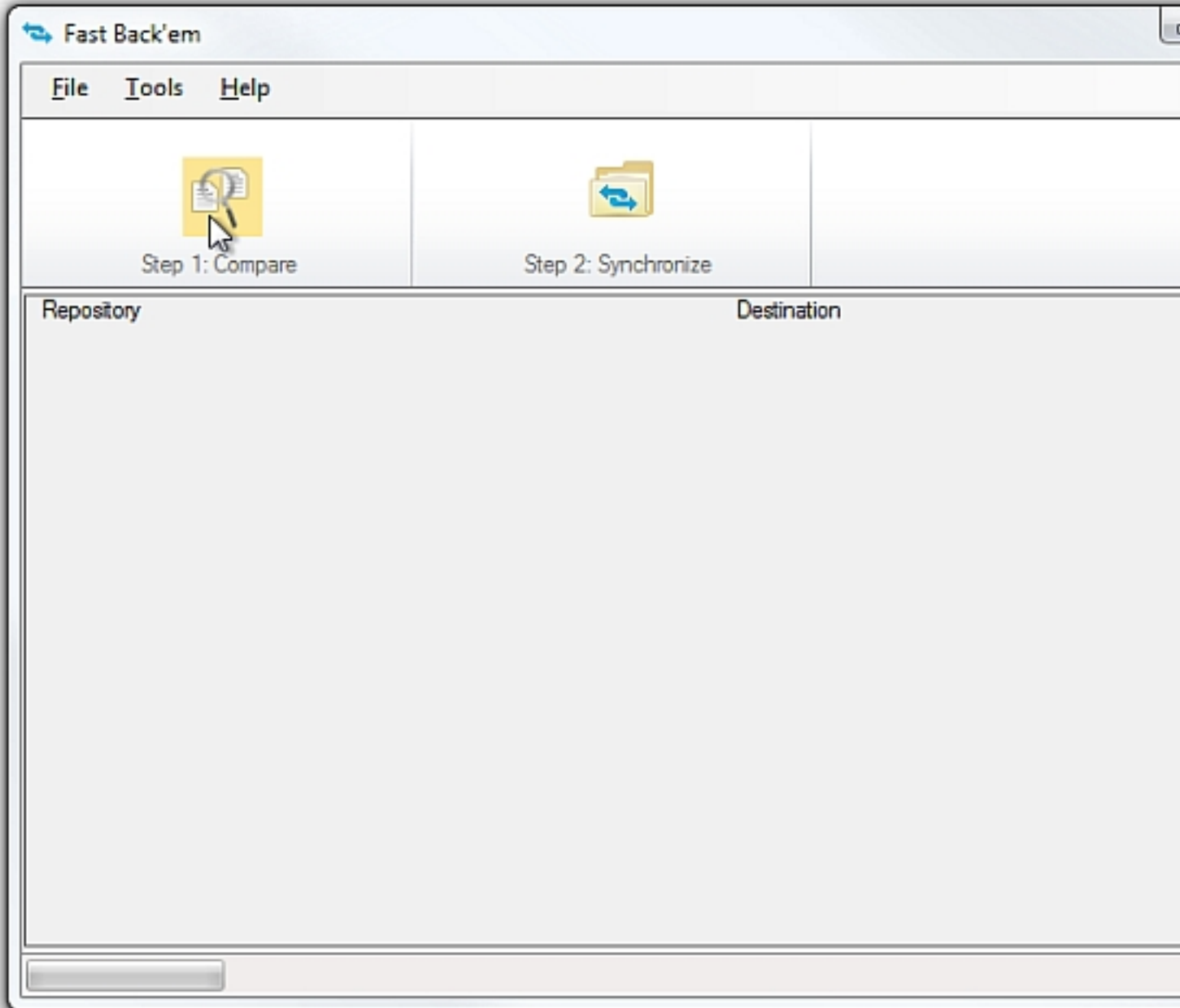

Data backup tools are not that hard to find, too, but if you're still in search for one that suits your taste, try **Fast Back'em**, an application for Windows that lets you effortlessly create backup copies and the whole procedure is pretty quick. The application employs a system governed by synchronization logic that reduces the overall time taken for backups. It compares files between the destination directory and your data

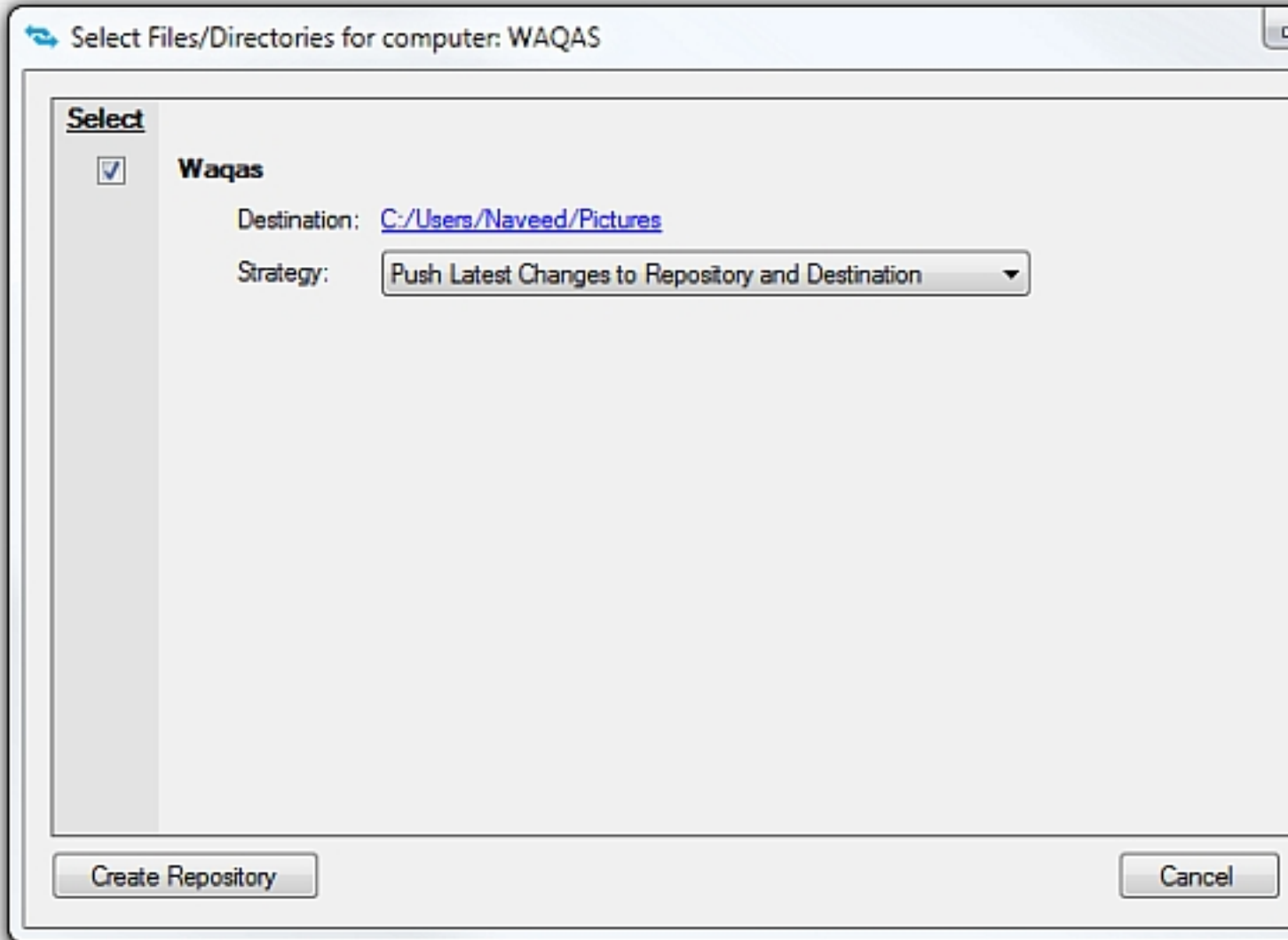
### *Repository*

, and moves only those files to the backup folder that are new or have been recently updated. This way, the backup can be created on multiple computers.

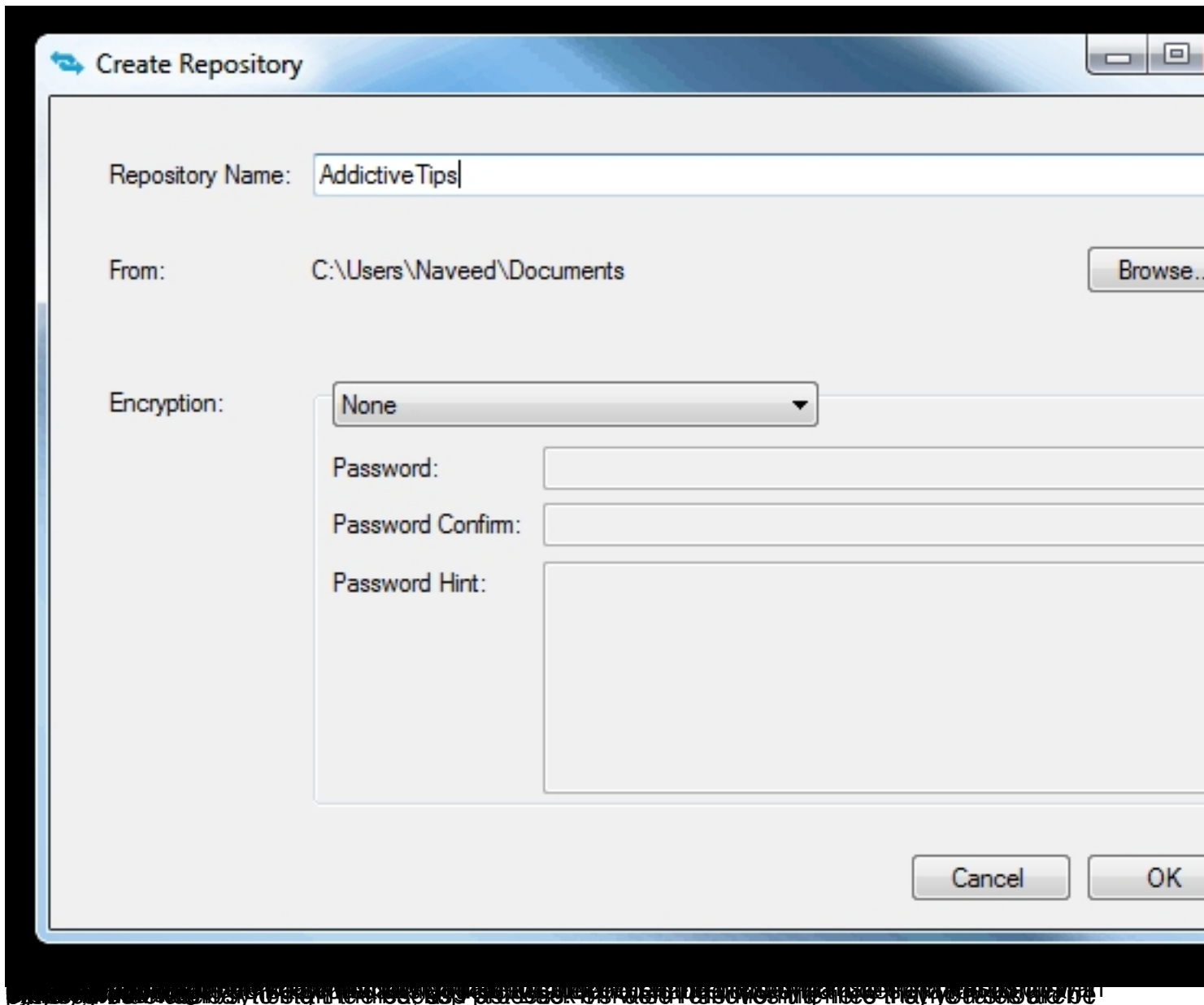
In order to use the application, copy the executable file to the directory where you want to create backup. Upon launch, you will be presented with a simple interface. There are two buttons at the top; *Compare* and *Synchronize*. Click *Compare* to open the *Repository* container window.

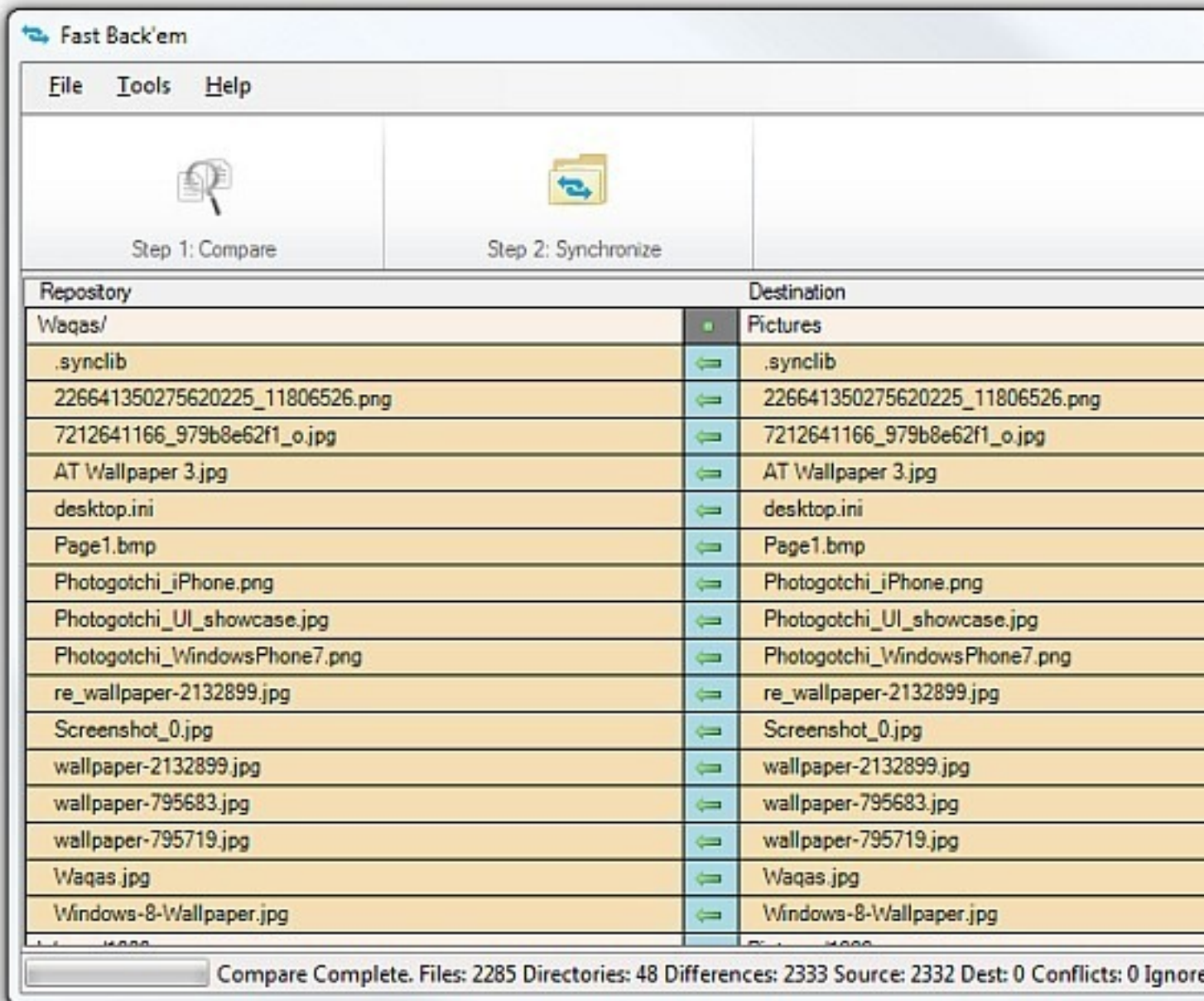


Fast Back'em is a free file synchronization software that allows you to sync files between multiple PCs with
